1	Detached	A house not attached to another house
2	Semi-detached	A house or bungalow attached to one other
3	Terraced	A row of houses joined to each other
4	Bungalow	A house with no stairs – a word originally from the Hindi language
5	Flat	A home usually in a block with others – they usually have no stairs
6	Community	The area where we live
7	Castle	A type of home built to protect the people that lived inside it
8	Toys	An object for a child to play with
9	Games	To be played either on your own or with others – games usually have rules

Did you know...?

The population of Haverhill is about 27,000
Haverhill has been a market town for 950 years
In the 1950s, lots of new homes were built in Haverhill for people in London after their homes were destroyed during World War II
Haverhill is twinned with 2 towns – Pont St. Esprit (France) and Ehringshausen (Germany)
Teddy Bears are named after US President Theodore Roosevelt
Lego is from Denmark and can be translated to 'play well'.
